Post-Prague: EU-India relations

India and the EU are "two natural partners" that must find a way to fight global challenges together, Benita Ferro-Waldner, the EU Commissioner for External Relations, said ahead of the EU-India ministerial troika in Prague last Monday, 29 June 2009.

Yet there is something unsatisfactory about this partnership. India and the EU are two of the world's largest power centres, sharing a commitment to democracy, respect for the rule of law and a stable international order. But these bilateral summits need a shot of energy: though friendly, this relationship lacks substance.

The EU's 2003 Security Strategy identifies the US as its closest ally and five other powers with which it seeks "strategic partnerships"- China, India, Canada, Japan and Russia. Besides Russia, it is with India that the EU has the least inspiring relations. Unlike with Russia, there are no fundamental divides among EU member states standing in the way of a coherent EU strategy.

Such a strategy must go well beyond seeing India as a pure economic power. Rather, it should include a strong security dimension not least since India is a crucial player and a potential anchor of stability in a volatile region. A broader strategic cooperation between the EU and India on nuclear nonproliferation, counter-terrorism, food security, and failed or failing states should be pursued. On Afghanistan, Pakistan and Iran, there is much the EU and India can and should do together.

India also stands to profit from a more dynamic relationship with the EU. While bilateral trade has more than doubled since 2003, totalling more than €55 billion in 2007, the Free Trade Agreement launched in 2007 remains deadlocked by EU attempts to gain access to

the banking, aviation and telecommunications sectors. If "the summits between India and the EU reflect the importance of their relationship," according to Indian Foreign Minister S.M. Krishna, then India needs to broaden its economic partnership with the EU. India and Europe also need to find a way to deal with their divides on climate change.

Turning this lacklustre relationship into a real partnership will require time and energy. *Mindsets will need to adjust. The EU should see India as a pivotal regional player and an aspiring global power in transition rather than merely a developing nation.* India needs to recognize the EU's growing political influence, and not see the EU only as an important trade bloc.

If the summit in New Delhi later this year is to be more than a talkfest, India and the EU will need to focus more on the substance of their relationship.
