

Call for Contributions

We invite Ukrainian scholars, researchers and practitioners to submit proposals for policy briefs to contribute to our project "<u>Feminist Perspectives for Supporting Ukraine</u>." Each policy brief should present a feminist analysis of a social or political problem posed by the war as well as recommendations on what feminist solutions could look like. We aim to provide international policymakers and practitioners with actionable analyses that inform the implementation of gender-transformative action in and for Ukraine. GPPi will publish the policy briefs in English and Ukrainian.

As we hope to highlight a broad range of topics, we encourage creative thinking and welcome abstracts that delve into diverse feminist perspectives on the war on Ukraine. While not exhaustive, the following list provides some ideas for *potential* topics:

- How does the war impact the political participation of women and marginalized groups? What can be done to support these actors better?
- What impact does the war have on members of Ukraine's LGBTQI+ community and other national minorities such as e.g. Roma? How can international actors best assist them?
- What are the gendered consequences of the war for the Ukrainian security sector? E.g.: What are the specific needs of female veterans?
- What are the gendered dimensions of internal migration in Ukraine? How can we tackle these challenges?
- What are the reasons for sexualized violence in Ukraine? What can be done to address them?

Participating in GPPi's policy brief series comes with the following benefits:

- Your work will be published and distributed among policymakers, researchers, practitioners, and the general public.
- You will receive remuneration (800€) for your research. Additional remuneration for translation work may apply.
- You will join a community of feminist scholars, researchers and practitioners who promote feminist perspectives for supporting Ukraine.

Submission Details

Please send an abstract of your proposed topic (max. 300 words) and your CV in English to <u>ukr-ffp@gppi.net</u> by **November 26th, 2023.**

The abstract should detail the topic you plan to discuss, why it is relevant for policymakers and practitioners, and how you want to approach it methodologically. We ask that your CV highlight your expertise on your proposed topic and – if applicable – any relevant experiences with action-oriented research as well as relevant publications. We highly encourage submissions from junior experts, women, members of the LGBTQI+ community, people with disabilities, IDPs, refugees, and other minority communities.
